

**Deborah Pittman** is a classically trained clarinetist, ceramist, performance artist and writer. A native New Yorker, she is Professor Emeritus of clarinet and studies in American Music at CSUS Sacramento (where she taught from 1991 to 2013). She was a lecturer at UC Davis for ten years. Her educational background includes: BS and MA degrees in Music Performance from Brooklyn College Conservatory and Doctoral studies at the Manhattan School of Music.

She has been a solo and chamber performing artist on both coasts, with feature performances in Japan and South Korea. Her commissioned works for family concert series include: Peter in the Hood, Niam: Portrait of a Gnome, In the Land of Picklesnout Gouch, and Small Shoulders/ Big Dreams. Her documentary films include: Convergence II (a film and concert series on Historic Oak Park), The Extraordinary Life of Joseph

Bologne Chevalier De Saint-Georges (a short film, award winning film, study guide and music videos from the film score, available free to educators) and The World According to Earl (created with a grant from the NEA). This work has received awards from 8 film festivals.
